Destinations in the proposed itinerary include Salzburg, Munich, Fussen, Rgensburg, Pilsen, Prague, Vienna, Bratislava and Budapest. The group will enjoy sightseeing tours, and special events throughout the tour in addition to approximately 3 exhibition hockey games and 5 tournament games. The tournament in the German Alps has a division for teams 50+. If we have enough players we may split the team in two and enter two teams in the tournament to ensure plenty of ice time for everyone.

A highlight of the tour is a day Munich with a guided city tour followed by an afternoon at Oktoberfest with reserved tables at the Armbrusschützenzelt beer tent until 4:30 p.m.. Oktoberfest is the world's largest Volksfest, featuring a beer festival and a travelling carnival.

This once in a lifetime sporting experience is open to family and friends who would like to join us.

Visitors can experience the mine's history, ancient mining tools, and the environment on a miner's train, wooden slides, and an underground salt lake boat trip. The tour also includes a journey through the Salina Celtic Village.

Füssen is a Bavarian town in Germany known for being the southern end of the Romantic Road, a major tourist route. It is a popular base for visiting the nearby Neuschwanstein and Hohenschwangau castles and offers its own attractions, such as its medieval town center, the Hohes Schloss castle, and the former St. Mang Benedictine Abbey. The town is located on the border with Austria and is surrounded by the Alps and several lakes, making it a hub for outdoor activities.

Morning guided tour of Mad King Ludwig's Neuschwanstein Castle.

Neuschwanstein Castle is a 19th-century historicist palace in the Bavarian Alps of Germany, built by King Ludwig II as a private retreat and homage to Richard Wagner. Though never fully completed, its construction began in 1869 and it is known for its fairytale appearance, which inspired Disney's Sleeping Beauty Castle. Located near the town of Füssen, it's a major tourist attraction that opened to the public shortly after the king's death in 1886. The interiors are decorated with murals depicting scenes from Wagner's operas, such as Lohengrin and Tannhäuser.

The nearby Hohenschwangau Castle is a 19th-century palace in Bavaria, Germany, that served as the childhood home of King Ludwig II. Originally a medieval ruin, it was acquired by Ludwig's

father, King Maximilian II, who rebuilt it as a summer and hunting residence in the Romantic style. The castle's interior is decorated with murals based on German myths, and it was the setting for Ludwig's upbringing before he began building his own famous castle, Neuschwanstein.

Munich is the capital of Bavaria and Germany's third-largest city, known for its rich culture, history, and vibrant beer halls and festivals, including Oktoberfest. Historically a center of fine architecture and art, it became a focal point for right-wing politics and the rise of the Nazi party before being heavily damaged in World War II. Today, the city is a major German economic, cultural, and educational hub, featuring beautiful parks, palaces, and museums, while also serving as a popular base for day trips to the nearby Alps.



Arrive at Oktoberfest with reserved tables at the Armbrustschützenzelt beer tent until 4:30.

Oktoberfest is the world's largest beer festival and funfair, held annually in Munich, Germany, at the Theresienwiese (Theresa's Meadow) from mid-September to the first Sunday in October. Originating in 1810 to celebrate the marriage of Crown Prince Ludwig and Princess Therese, the festival has grown to include amusement rides, food, parades, and traditional Bavarian music, drawing millions of visitors each year.

The Armbrustschützenzelt is a traditional and historic beer tent at the Munich Oktoberfest, known for its crossbow shooting tradition, traditional Bavarian atmosphere, and excellent food. Established in 1895 by the Winzerer Fährndel crossbowmen's guild, it features a dedicated area for shooting competitions and is decorated like a hunting lodge. The tent is generally considered less rowdy than others and features live brass music, Paulaner beer, and a variety of Bavarian dishes.

Check in to the hotel.

Evening free to relax, explore Munich or return to Oktoberfest.

Depart for Regensburg

Arrive in Regensburg and enjoy free time to explore the old town and have lunch on your own.

Regensburg is a 2,000-year-old city in Bavaria, Germany, known for its exceptionally well-preserved medieval Old Town, which is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Located on the Danube River, the city was founded by the Romans in 179 AD as Castra Regina, the city has vestiges of its Roman past, like the Porta Praetoria. Later Regensburg was a capital for the Carolingians and the Holy Roman Empire, experiencing a golden age in the Middle Ages as a trading and political hub. The city is considered Germany's best-preserved medieval city, having been largely spared from WWII bombing. Its historic architecture including St. Peter's Cathedral, the Stone Bridge, and the Old City Hall are remarkably intact. Today, it is a prosperous city with a vibrant cultural scene, two universities, and a major port on the Danube.

The Regensburg Germany Sausage Kitchen, or Wurstkuchl, is a historic restaurant next to the stone bridge over the Danube that claims to be the world's oldest continuously open restaurant and sausage kitchen. It began in the 12th century as a food stand for workers building the bridge and Cathedral, serving simple fare like sausages and sauerkraut, and has maintained a

similar menu ever since.

Short boat cruises are available that highlight landmarks like the 12th-century Stone Bridge and offer views of the city's well-preserved medieval architecture, Roman ruins, and the confluence of the Danube, Regen, and Naab rivers.



Depart for Pilsen and enjoy a guided tour of the famous Pilsner brewery.

A Pilsner brewery tour offers a deep dive into the history of the world's first golden lager, Pilsner Urquell. You will learn about the traditional brewing process and ingredients to the modern brewhouse and bottling plant. Highlights include a walk through the brewery's ancient and new areas plus an opportunity for adults to taste the unfiltered Pilsner Urquell directly from oak lager casks in the historic cellars. The brewery shop offers various items with the famous brand.

After the tour the group will enjoy dinner at the brewery restaurant.

Depart for Prague and check in to the hotel on arrival.

Depart for Prague Castle and meet your guide for a Prague walking tour.

Prague Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is the world's largest coherent castle complex and the historical and modern seat of power for Bohemian kings, Holy Roman Emperors, and the official residence of presidents of the Czech Republic. Founded in the 9th century, it features a monumental complex of palaces, churches fortifications, and gardens, representing various architectural styles. The complex is also the home to the Czech Crown Jewels. The St. Vitus Cathedral, located in Prague Castle, is the most important Gothic church in the Czech Republic and serves as a significant spiritual and national symbol for the country. It was used for coronations, and houses the tombs of Bohemian kings, Holy Roman Emperors, saints, and archbishops. Notable tombs include that of Saint Wenceslaus, the patron saint of the country, and the silver tomb of John of Nepomuk, the 14th-century Bohemian saint martyred for refusing to reveal the secrets of the queen's confession. Construction of the Cathedral began in 1344 under Charles IV and was completed in 1929, incorporating stunning architectural features like the St. Wenceslas Chapel and intricate stained-glass windows, including one by Alfons Mucha.

Prague's Old Town is a historic medieval settlement known for the Old Town Square, which has been the city's main market and cultural hub since the 10th century. Key landmarks include the Old Town Hall with its Astronomical Clock, the Gothic Church of Our Lady before Týn, the Baroque St. Nicholas Church, and a statue of Jan Hus. Visitors can explore its narrow streets, admire its diverse architecture, and enjoy seasonal markets and street performances. Prague is the capital of the Czech Republic, located in Central Europe on the Vltava River, and is renowned for its stunning architecture spanning various eras, including Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque. A major economic and cultural hub, the city is known as the "City of a Hundred Spires" and the "Heart of Europe". Key landmarks include Prague Castle, Charles Bridge, and the Old Town Square, and the city offers a rich history, vibrant atmosphere, and famous local beer, making it a popular tourist destination.

The Moravian Karst (Moravský kras) is a protected landscape area and a significant karst region in the Czech Republic, north of Brno, known for its vast system of over 1,100 caves, deep gorges, and limestone formations, including the famous Macocha Abyss. This fluviokarst, developed in Devonian limestone by water action over millennia, features both above and below-ground phenomena like subterranean rivers, underground lakes, and unique calcareous formations, with several cave systems open to the public for tours

Enjoy a guided tour of the caves including through an underground river.

The Vienna Prater is a large recreational area and amusement park in Vienna, Austria, known for its free entry with pay-per-attraction rides, including the iconic Giant Ferris Wheel. It features two main sections: the Green Prater, a vast, quiet park with meadows and shady paths, and the Wurstelprater, the bustling entertainment area with about 250 rides, restaurants, and food stands. Visitors can enjoy everything from thrilling roller coasters and ghost trains to traditional cafés and outdoor sports, making it a diverse destination for relaxation, excitement, and fun.

The Schweizerhaus restaurant at the Prater has a nice beer garden restaurant.

Vienna, Austria's capital, is a city known for its rich Habsburg heritage, musical history, and Baroque architecture, exemplified by palaces like Schönbrunn Palace and landmarks such as St. Stephen's Cathedral. Situated on the Danube River, it's a major cultural, economic, and

political center, offering a high quality of life with a slow pace, pedestrian-friendly streets, and iconic coffee houses.

The Vienna Belvedere is a historic complex featuring two Baroque palaces—Upper and Lower Belvedere—built as a summer residence for Prince Eugene of Savoy. It now houses the Belvedere Museum, showcasing a vast collection of Austrian art, including famous works by Gustav Klimt, like "The Kiss". The complex is known for its stunning Baroque architecture, elaborate interiors, and French-style gardens, and is a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Bratislava is the capital and largest city of Slovakia, situated on the Danube River where it borders Austria and Hungary, making it the only capital city to border two sovereign nations. It boasts a picturesque Old Town, the majestic Bratislava Castle, and a blend of medieval history with modern life. With a rich 2,000-year history and a unique cultural scene, Bratislava also offers significant natural beauty, being flanked by mountains and the Danube, and is a vital political and economic center for Slovakia.
