



## PRAGUE METRO

On the attached Prague Metro Map you can see that there are three lines in GREEN, RED and the one you will use most, YELLOW. Our hotel in Prague, the Clarion Congress hotel is located right at the stop **VYSOCANSKA** on the YELLOW line.

The stops you will most likely use the most are **NAMESTI REPUBLIKY** and **MUSTEK** which are both right in the city center. A ride from Vysocanska to the farthest station Mustek is usually about 12 minutes. On the next page you will find a map of the section of the yellow line you will need.



When you come down into the Vysocanska station you will see a sign that says Track 1 and Track 2. The direction of each track is listed with the end station so if you are going downtown then you want Track 1 which is headed to the ZLICIN station. If you are coming back from downtown then you want the track at MUSTEK or NAMESTI REPUBLIKY that is headed to CERNY MOST.

You have to validate the ticket on the yellow machines as you enter the station. You insert the bottom end with the arrow and it will print the date and time that you start your trip. You must validate the ticket or else you can get a fine from transit police.

The tickets can be used for as many rides as you wish on Metro and trams within the validity period. If you want to start your trip on a tram then you can validate your ticket on a validation machine on the tram. You can validate the ticket only once. If you want more tickets you can purchase them at the machines at the station or at tram stops.

*\*If asked, children aged 10 - 15 and seniors over 60 must be able to prove their age to an inspector.*



### HOW LONG DOES THE METRO OPERATE?

Trains run from around 4:45 a.m. and the last train leaves its station of origin at midnight. Night trams and buses must be used when the metro is closed. Trains arrive in 1-3 min. intervals during the peak hours of the morning and afternoon commute and in 4-10 min. intervals in the off hours. The time that has elapsed from the moment when the previous train left the station can be seen on the clock at the head of the tracks.

All stations are equipped with escalators and about two thirds of all metro stations allow access for the disabled.

### JOURNEY PLANNER

This journey planner is very helpful. It directs you to which metro trains and trams you need to get to your destination.
